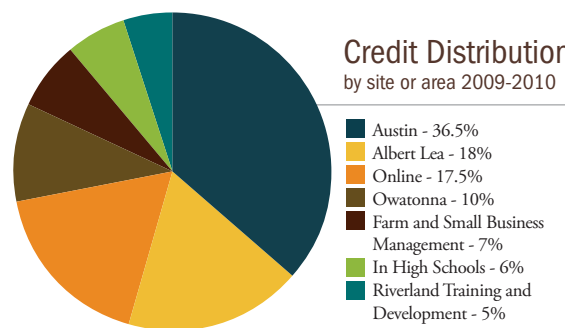
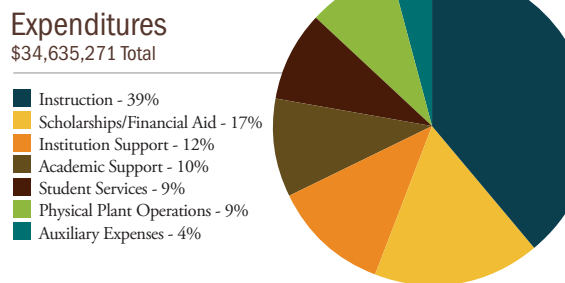
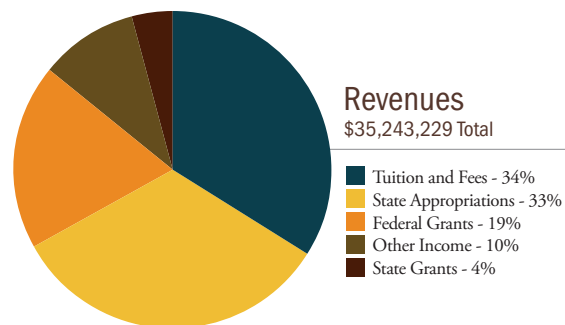
STUDENT LEARNING GOALS
