- **Evening program format** - Expect to be on campus up to 3 evenings per week from 5-9 pm. Clinicals will be held during the day and/or on weekends.
- **General Education Courses listed in black font in semesters 1-4 can be taken earlier, but no later than the identified semester. Note: Due to the layout of the RN evening program, students in this pathway are strongly encouraged to complete all the General Education Courses prior to the start of the program.**
- **To apply to the RN program:** Complete the nursing program application, complete the ATI TEAS Test within 3 years of application with a cut score of 58.6% or above. All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher and have a combined minimum GPA of 2.75 or higher. A copy of the TEAS score report and proof of being on the Nursing Assistant registry will need to be submitted with the program application.
- **RN program admission** is based strictly on total points. To calculate, combine your ATI TEAS Test Score divided by 10 to your GPA in the prerequisite courses (GPA must be 2.75 or higher). *Point Sample:* TEAS Test Score of 82.5% divided by 10 = 8.25 + 3.75 GPA = 12 total points earned. **Your prerequisite course GPA can be found via your E-Services account by clicking on the Academic Records tab and viewing your Pre-Nursing Degree Audit Report.**
- **Admitted students** are required to register, attend, and pass NURS1200 in order to begin the nursing program. This 16-hour orientation that will take place 1-2 weeks prior to the program semester start. All nursing courses must be successfully completed in the semester indicated in order to progress to the next semester.
- Credits in Associate Degree: 30 nursing; 34 general education= 64 total. Credits in B.S. Program: 30 nursing; 10 upper (300-400 level); 16 elective credits = 120 total.
- **Additional classes you may consider** taking at Riverland that would transfer to Winona State University as "upper level" credits are: Cultural Diversity (SOC1 2125), Abnormal Psychology (PSYC 1250), Social Psychology (PSYC 2260) and Cultural Anthropology (ANTH 2240).
- Clinical requirements will require a background check, CPR certification, health insurance, immunizations (including an annual flu shot).
