A. HSER 2203 Internship IV - Internship in Chemical Dependency

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Internship IV is a primary internship in the Human Services Program. Each student performs a total of 440 hours in a chemical dependency treatment center. This course is only to be taken by students who are pursuing a Licensed Drug and Alcohol Counselor (LADC) with the State of Minnesota. This course meets half of the State of Minnesota's 880 hour requirement for LADC. There will be 5-6 two-hour classroom sessions.

(8 Cr – 8 lect, 0 lab)

<u>CS</u>	perform job search and interview skills.	1. participate in mock interviews. 2. create a working resume and cover letter.
<u>CS</u>	demonstrate good attendance, responsible work habits, and good boundaries with clients and staff.	1. meet internship expectations as evaluated by site supervisor and program coordinator.
