A. ACCT1023 Computerized Accounting with SageTM

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers basic use of SageTM software for commercial application and possible SageTM user exam certification. SageTM is basic general ledger accounting software for microcomputers used to generate basic financial reports. This course is a component of the Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in accounting, which is accredited by the Accreditation Council of Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP). Pre-requisites: BUSO1620, BUSA1060, basic microcomputer competency, or instructor approval. Also required is ACCT2011 or concurrent enrollment. (**3** Cr – **3** lect, **0** lab)
