A. AUTO 2445 Fuel Systems II

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers in-depth theory, principles, diagnosis, and repair of vehicle fuel delivery and control systems. This course, along with other program courses, satisfies the task requirements set forth in Section VIII of the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) accreditation. Prerequisites: AUTO 1341, AUTO 1431 or instructor approval.
