



MASTER COURSE OUTLINE

A. COSM 1120 Clinical I

B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This practical application course includes specific client services. Under instructor supervision, students provide services including shampooing, conditioning, cutting, styling, manicuring, and pedicuring to mannequins, classmates, and clients. Students develop skills in hairstyling, hair shaping, and chemical procedures. Salon safety, sanitation and infection control are stressed. Students experience salon reception and dispensary service work. Satisfactorily completed quotas accumulate to meet quota requirements. Prerequisites: COSM1100, COSM1105, COSM1110, COSM1115 and COSM1116.
(5 Cr – 0 lect, 5 lab)
