<u>CS</u>	disassemble various 4x4 transfer cases.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> remove and replace a transfer case from a four-wheel drive vehicle. disassemble and reassemble the front hubs of four-wheel drive vehicles. remove and replace a drive shaft and universal joints. disassemble and reassemble constant velocity joints. remove and replace a C/V joint shaft and the C/V boot. disassemble and reassemble training aid transfer case.
<u>CS</u>	identify power flow.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> explain transfer case high and low range planetary gear power flow. explain final drive power flow. repair customer vehicles as assigned by the instructor.
