B. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course focuses on completion of quotas. Students review Minnesota statutes and rules in preparation for the required skill readiness test and salon experience. Anatomy and physiology relevant to cosmetology are also reviewed. Prerequisites: COSM 1100, COSM 1105, COSM 1110, COSM 1115, COSM 1125, and COSM 1130.
