## STEPS TO CREATING A RUBRIC

- 1. Identify Objective
  - Student Performance (what)
  - Conditions (how, where, tools)
  - Criteria (measurement)
- 2. Create Dimensions (concepts/tasks)
  - what skills/concepts are important?
    - left-hand column
- 3. Gradations and Points
- 4. Define criteria per level
  - what defines excellent?
  - what is missing or flawed in other levels?
  - easiest to start with highest level/ideal
